



High School Age Workshops

Name	Grade Level	Description
Healthy Relationships	7-12	An interactive workshop where we explore the basics of healthy relationships. The relationship spectrum is used to help explore the signs and indicators of a healthy, unhealthy or abusive relationship.
Consent	7-12	Youth will learn what is required to actively give consent. We will explore respecting boundaries and challenge norms that support sexual violence. Youth will also learn how to support a survivor of a sexual assault.
Online Safety	6-12	In this presentation middle and high school students will learn the legalities behind sending sexual images online and have a better understanding of online safety
Bystander Intervention	7-12	This interactive workshop is designed to support youth to be an active bystander within their spheres of influence. There is a focus on understanding consent, dissecting cultural norms that promote sexual violence and the importance of being a leader who role models a collective responsibility approach. We will explore the positive impact that intentional bystander intervention can have and ways youth can increase skills for effective approaches to difficult situations.
Safe Dates	9-12	An evidence based program focused on prevention of teen dating violence. Presentation description from SafeDates: this program helps teens recognize the difference between caring, supportive relationships and controlling, manipulative, or abusive relationships https://www.hazelden.org/web/public/safedates.page
In Their Shoes	9-12	A participatory experience. Participants become one of six, teen characters based on the experiences of real teens including sexting, pregnancy, homophobia and stalking. They make choices about their relationships and move through the scenario by reading about interactions with their dating partner, family, friends, counselors, police, and others. Created by the Washington State Coalition Against Domestic Violence.
